We are sad to report the passing of longtime Los Angeles Radio Engineer Bob Conger on February 27 as a result of Cancer. He was 78.

Bob came to Los Angeles from the San Francisco area in about 1976 to become the longtime Chief Engineer for KFAC AM-1330 and KFAC-FM 92.3, which later became "The Beat" while Bob was there.

Bob worked with many stations in the Southern California area doing build-outs and maintenance at transmitter sites as well as studios such as Multi-Cultural Broadcasting, KMPC AM-710, KSCA-FM 101.9 and El Dorado Broadcasting, to name a few.

Most recently, Bob had been doing the engineering work for KPFK 90.7.

Bob was a very gentle and caring person who was willing to go out of his way to help anyone. He was very experienced and knowledgeable and was a devoted family man who will be greatly missed.

Bob is survived by his wife Jane, sons John and Jerry, and daughters Amy and Catherine, and grandchildren Christine, Michaela, Charlotte, and Rob.
