Robert Reymont passed away at home on Tuesday, September 28, 2018. He was 72.

Reymont grew up in Santa Fe, NM and attended the University of New Mexico at Las Cruces. His hobby was carpentry and cabinet making.

While still in school, Reymont started at KOBE, Las Cruces, later KGRT, Las Cruces, NM.

He then was hired in the Spring of 1974 to come to WGAR in Cleveland to do maintenance and help in a rebuild of the directional antenna and – using his talents in cabinet-making, moved/constructed the new studios. While at WGAR, Reymont was sent to Elkins Institute to get a 1st Class Operator's License.

In the 1980s, he moved permanently to Mesa (Phoenix), AZ. and was hired by Nationwide as group chief engineer as they built a larger group. After Nationwide, Reymont went out on his own, forming Double R Consulting to do engineering, applications, NRSC measurements, and other services, including becoming Chairman of the Arizona EAS SECC.

Reymont was known in Phoenix and around the state as a hospitable person, holding a regular picnic in his back yard,

Reymont is survived by his partner, Jorge.
